The students in our center had an opportunity to share about their life-changing experiences to school students and the people who live around our Teen Challenge Center. Drugs have spread throughout our society and have spread even to the

remote rural areas. Many young people have started using drug and their lives have been really messed up. As a result, they sold themselves to prostitution and other forms of sexual exploitation. Teen Challenge was asked to be on a Christian Leaders Addiction Network Committee to work closely with other churches and NGOs to educate people about drugs. This is the best

way to reduce drug consumption and addictions within the youth of Cambodia. We wanted to say a big thanks to our volunteers, staff and the community people for their participation and active involvement.

Life on the Streets

Som Chea, 20 years old, was born in the city of Phnom Penh. His family was very poor and his parents died of AIDS several years ago. Som Chea has four siblings and he is the second child in his family. Since his parents' death three of his siblings were separated from him. Som Chea and his siblings used to live on the streets for almost 9 years. He begged for money and scavenged through the rubbish as a means of supporting himself and enabling him to use all of kinds of drugs with other street children. Sometimes Som Chea stole things from his neighbors. From time to time he got beaten up until he was almost dead.



"For me I think Teen Challenge is very great because I have a new life through Teen Challenge. Before I could not understand much but now I have knowledge and skills that I can use. Teen Challenge led me to know the Person who can give me hope for the present and the future, that Person is the Lord Jesus Christ.. The Teen Challenge Center helped me a lot, and so I want to say thank you to Teen Challenge."

After spending so many years living on the streets in the city, Som Chea was caught by the Phnom Penh Department of Social Affair and sent to the Teen Challenge Center in Takeo province.

I really would hate to go back to my old life, and I am afraid of that. I am very grateful and blessed to be in such a program like this. *"I wish I could at least be a volunteer staff of the Teen Challenge Center in the future.
